STRATEGIC PRIORITIES FOR THE VILLAGE

The Village of Los Lunas has grown a lot over the last couple decades. It takes planning by Village staff and the Village council, with input from the community, to encourage and accommodate such growth.

Creating strategic priorities is one of the ways Village Officials encourage and accommodate growth while making improvements to the community.

The Village council has approved strategic priorities for 2023-2027 to create a better community for everyone. The priorities have goals and actions to accomplish as part of the plan.

Strategic priority #1 is the Interstate 25 interchange and East/West corridor which is scheduled to go South of the current Interstate 25, Los Lunas exit at Mile Marker 203.

The council hopes that by September 2024 construction will have started on the new East-West arterial roadway from I-25 to NM Hwy 47. This priority includes a full four-lane river bridge, full interchange at I-25, and two lanes in both directions from NM Hwy 47 to I-25.

Priority #2 is quality of life improvements to completely design, fund, and construct a new Public Library and indoor Aquatic Center.

The goal of this priority is to design a new modern and appropriately sized library to be built on a site adjacent to the west of the current library on Main Street.

The indoor Aquatic Center would be located on the site adjacent to the current Daniel Fernandez Recreation Center off NM Hwy 314.

Strategic Priority #3 is to work on the current infrastructure by enhancing, updating, modifying, and improving Village-owned water, sewer, wastewater, stormwater, pedestrian, bicycle, roadway, landscape and traffic infrastructure which support current and future residential, commercial and industrial development.

Goals to be accomplished while working on this infrastructure include:

- completing the overhaul of water well #4 which includes drilling a water well,
- replacing current arsenic treatment facilities, and
- refurbishing water storage tank #4.

The Village hopes to complete the construction of new water well #8 including associated water arsenic treatment facilities by July 2025 as part of priority #3.

By January 2026 the Village wants to improve access and connectivity for pedestrians and bicyclists. Details for such improvements can be found in the village pedestrian plan and proposed bikeway plan located on the village website loslunasnm.gov.

Removing and replacing all asbestos-lined water pipes within the Village limits is hoped to be accomplished by January 2027.

The Village hopes to start the construction of a new membrane bioreactor (MBR) wastewater treatment facility by January 2027.

Priority #4 centers around economic development and includes:

- ensuring new companies pay a living wage
- keeping the revenue stream of construction gross receipts tax
- completing the Main Street overlay project
- developing and implementing a Main Street building facade program.

The economic development priority would also develop and implement strategies for supporting small businesses and businesses in older parts of the Village. Another economic development goal is development of quality affordable housing throughout the community.

Strategic priority #5 revolves around personnel and would ensure staffing levels and positions keep up with community and organizational need and growth. This priority would also involve completing the latest compensation and classification study including public safety pay.

FLEET MAINTENANCE SCORES

Village employees working in fleet maintenance recently tested and achieved certification or recertification within their field of expertise with the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence (ASE).

Since 1972 ASE, an independent non-profit organization <https://www.ase.com/>, has worked to improve the quality of vehicle repair and service by testing and certifying automotive professionals.

The Village of Los Lunas is a member of ASE and has the authority to utilize the ASE logo on the Village website and uniforms. Village technicians who participated in training and tested are:

- Miguel Cossio passed Diesel Engines ASE for Medium / Heavy Trucks.
- Troy Hibdon recertified in Steering and Suspension and Preventive Maintenance on his ASE for Medium/Heavy Truck.
- Eric Beach recertified in Engine performance on his ASE for Automotive.

TELEVISION TRASH

Village residents no longer have to pay to dispose of televisions (used to be \$25 for up to 42 inch).

Village residents can drop televisions off at the transfer station on NM Hwy 6 west of I-25.

County residents should drop their sets off at Conejo Transfer Station on the east mesa.

The Village has increased the charge for a commercial trash bin locking mechanism to \$36 from \$50. In addition, if the customer requests a replacement trash bin lock the new cost is \$12 per lock.

The Village is charging what the locks cost.

AT THE LEGISLATURE

Village officials participated in several events at the 2023 session of the New Mexico State Legislature.

Municipal Day included breakfast, speakers, and a Municipal Day Session.

Valencia County Day at the Round House in Santa Fe included Village employees and community partners preparing and serving approximately 350 matanza-style lunches to state senators, state representatives, their staff, and members of the general public.

In addition, more than 120 "goodie bags" were given to state legislators with promotional items from throughout Valencia County.

TIME TO ENTER STUDENT ART SHOW

The theme for this year's 10th Annual Student Art show at the Village's Museum of Heritage & Arts is "Música y Baile" -- "Music and Dance."

Submissions will be accepted until April 10, 2023. Artwork will be on display April 15, 2023, thru June 10, 2023.

It is open to artists 18 years old or younger living in Valencia County.

- Entries must be original works and may be any medium (e.g. acrylic, oil, pastel, water color, pen and ink, photography, ceramics, fibers and mixed media) that portrays the specified theme.
- Abstract and non-representational works are welcome. However, works must be with the specified theme.

Artists may enter up to three works to be juried.

Artists may submit digital or printed entries via mail, email or in person. If possible, all student entries from a school should be turned in at the same time on the same device, or collected together in a binder.

If submitting printed versions of artwork, please include artist and title information on a separate piece of paper to keep your work anonymous for jurors. If submitting digital versions of artwork, acceptable files include PDF, JPG, TIFF or MSWORD files.

Printed photos, external storage device (CD or USB drive), or emailed file of submitted work. Artists accepted into the 2023 Student Juried Art Show will be notified by phone first, mail, as well by email.

Accepted works must be display-or hanging ready and delivered on or before April 8 thru 11, 2023.

Artists may choose to have artwork available for purchase throughout the exhibit. Pieces sold will remain in the show until its conclusion. (Elementary, middle, and high school categories)
