VILLAGE RECEIVES FUNDING

The Village of Los Lunas was successful in obtaining 2023 Legislative Capital Outlay funds for five of the ten requests made for funding.

The Village will receive the following:

1. Parks and Recreation Activity Vans, 2 units \$120,000
2. NM 6 Sound Barrier Wall \$750,000
3. Daniel Fernandez Park Improvements \$535,000
3. Sun Ranch and NM 6 Intersection Improvements \$950,000
4. Police Vehicle Replacement \$345,000

These funds will support various recreation program activities, emergency response and roadway improvements. When the agreements obtain approval these funds can be used as soon as July 24, 2023.

META DATA CENTER GRANTS AWARDED

The 2023 Meta Data Center Community Action Grants recipients have been announced.

Grants were awarded at an event held at the Los Lunas Data Center which brought together this year's grant recipients, community partners, Meta team members, and local leaders! Meta was formerly called Facebook. Through the Data Center Community Action Grants program, Meta provides funding for nonprofits and schools — and their projects that help put the power of technology to use for community benefit, connect people online or off and improve STEM education — to support the long-term vitality of Valencia County. Here's a little more on this year's recipients:

Facebook has committed to building strong partnerships within the community, and embracing the opportunity to have a positive local impact.

Belen Consolidated Schools - Belen High School: To support high school student engagement in information technology pathways by providing academic, technical and collaborative skills via competitive eSports, \$5,000.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central New Mexico: To support connecting students ages 6-12 in need of community-based mentoring services with one-to-one volunteer mentors in Los Lunas Schools, \$4,000.

Community Wellness Council: To support development of a Valencia County Service Directory app and web-based tool to address critical community health and service needs, \$9,000.

Dennis Chavez Elementary-Belen: To support creating a STEM unit in Physical Education involving STEM with bowling, \$3,400.

Explora Science Center & Children's Museum: To support Explora to provide STEM programming via "Community Science in Valencia County" for underserved children and families, \$15,000.

H2 Academic Solutions: To support a LEGO Robotics program for students in Belen to expand their STEM-based exposure and explore broader possibilities, \$5,600.

Los Lunas Middle School: To support engineering and enhanced STEAM education for students, \$5,000.

Los Lunas Schools: To support expanding virtual reality usage in middle and high school STEM education and support the development of industry certifications in school, \$40,000.

Rio Communities Optimist Club: To support STEM robotics camps for K-8 students across Valencia County, \$5,500.

School of Dreams Academy (S.O.D.A.): Education Foundation To support the expansion of a robust Biosafety Level 1 and 2 STEM Research Lab and program in Valencia County for all students \$20,000.

Sundance Elementary School (Los Lunas): To support increased student learning outcomes through technology tools by enhancing student voice, choice and access, \$12,000.

Teeniors: To support empowering older adults through intergenerational learning to create paid part-time jobs for youth and to decrease social isolation through genuine human connection, \$20,000.

Valencia County Amateur Radio Association: To support the establishment of amateur radio clubs and stations at two Los Lunas middle schools, \$10,000.

Valencia County Business Incubator: To support funding equipment and technology training for small businesses in Valencia County, \$20,000.

Valencia County Literacy Council: To support digital literacy, education and economic well-being across Valencia County \$20,000.

Valencia Shelter Services: To support updated technology and IT infrastructure for Valencia Shelter Services staff and survivors, \$15,500.

Wilderwood Equine Therapy: To support creating an online volunteer management system for Wilderwood Equine Therapy for autistic adults and children, \$2,000.

MOSQUITO CONTROL

Mosquitoes can be annoying and sometimes pose a serious risk to public health.

In certain areas of the United States, mosquitoes can transmit diseases like West Nile Virus and equine encephalitis. To combat mosquitoes and the public health hazards they present, the Village of Los Lunas has established a mosquito control program.

What can the citizens do to help control mosquitos:

- Empty and change the water in bird baths, fountains, wading pools, rain barrels, and potted plant trays at least once a week if not more often.
- Keep swimming pools treated and circulating and rain gutters unclogged.
- Make sure window and door screens are "bug tight."

Who is involved?

- State and local government agencies play a critical role in protecting public health from mosquito-borne diseases.
- They provide information to the medical and environmental networks that first identify possible outbreaks.
- They manage mosquito control programs that carry out prevention, public education and vector population management.
